





STATS OVER THE PAST 6 MONTHS

CCF's grant program, has awarded to 22 local 501(c) agencies through 35 grants made so far to provide for ongoing relief efforts for Coweta citizens affected by the tornado. \$600,000 has been allocated towards Long Term Recovery in 2021. To date funds have directly impacted 2,460 individuals in Coweta Co.



DONATIONS OVERVIEW: GRANTS

These grants provided ongoing funding for a wide range of local charitable efforts and programs to help tornado disaster survivors and disaster recovery; including hotel accommodations and long-term housing solutions for dislocated disaster survivors, youth programs for children affected by the tornado, food and family support programs, tree and root removal programs, and housing repair programs for affected homes.
