OPERATION RESTORE:

On February 18-19, the Foundation, with assistance from Yamaha Motor Corporation, Semperit Manufacturing, and dozens of dedicated volunteers, distributed thousands of donated IKEA home furnishings to more than 125 storm-affected families as they begin the transition back into their homes.

OUR FIRST "WELCOME HOME"!

On February 2, The Foundation took a moment to celebrate its first completed Full-Track assistance case.

Mr. Bruce Favors, a 65 year-old retiree of the Meriwether County School System, was a life-long resident of Newnan's historic Chalk Level neighborhood before the tornado. Unfortunately, he was uninsured and wasn't sure how he would repair the significant damage to his family home.

Thankfully, he applied to the Coweta Community Foundation for Full-Track construction assistance, and CCF, in conjunction with our nonprofit partners, provided not only skilled volunteer labor, but building materials and other financial assistance to rebuild his home and restore him to his pre-storm life.
