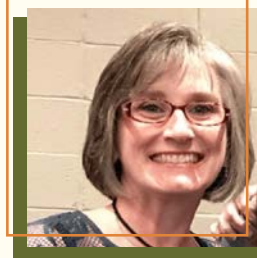

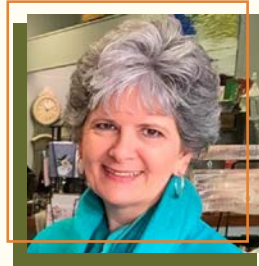

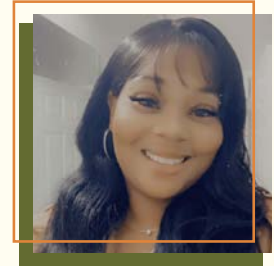

FUNDS IN ACTION...

COWETA STREET PARK

The Coweta Street Park Initiative, while a topic of conversation for many years, was jumped started in late 2021 with a commitment of a \$20,000 donation from AMC. Coweta Street Park was an old and dilapidated Senoia Housing Authority (SHA) park owned by the SHA. The project became a reality in January 2022 when the SHA Board approved the creation of a Coweta Street Park Initiative Steering Committee and becoming fiscally sponsored project of the Caring Communities Foundation (CCF).

As a fiscally sponsored project of the Caring Communities Foundation all cash donations flowed through CCF allowing the burden of financial management to be handled by CCF. CCF is a long established, annually audited local community 501c3 foundation. Additional benefits of the sponsorship include liability insurance, tax donation letters, and other misc. back-office admin support. The sponsorship allows the project steering committee to focus on fundraising and the core mission.



Coweta Street Park was renamed The Park of Hope. The ribbon cutting of the renovated park was on August 23, 2025, and the SHA transferred the park to the City of Senoia in November 2025. As a city park all the residents of Senoia can enjoy the park, breaking down the limiting opportunity wall and connecting all of Senoia's children-- bringing us closer to being one community. Besides the City taking over the park and all future maintenance, a new 501c3, Friends of the Park of Hope, was established and funded. Their focus will be focusing on educating and engaging a diverse public through a variety of programs, work collaboratively with public, private and other non-profit organizations.

NEWNAN CULTURAL ARTS COMMISSION

We are deeply grateful to the Caring Communities Foundation for opening the door to a transformative fiscal sponsorship that allows the Newnan Cultural Arts Commission (NCAC) to accept tax-deductible 501(c)(3) donations for the very first time. This partnership means we can dream bigger, raise more, and bring even richer arts experiences to our city—from vibrant music festivals and world-class dance performances to outdoor Shakespeare productions and inspiring downtown art installations that strengthen community bonds and spark creativity across generations.

Thanks to Caring Communities Foundation's trusted nonprofit framework and expert guidance, NCAC can now focus on what we do best: elevating the arts, educating and uplifting residents, and making Newnan a more connected and culturally alive place to call home. This collaboration is already fueling our growth

and ensuring that high-quality arts programming will flourish here for years to come—a heartfelt thank you to Caring Communities Foundation for believing in our mission and helping us make an even greater impact

The Joseph Clay Sherwood Memorial Scholarship

The Joseph Clay Sherwood Memorial Scholarship was established in 2018 in honor of Joe Sherwood, who tragically passed away the year prior. This \$2,500 scholarship is awarded to two eighth graders who receive the Noble Knight Award at Arnall Middle School, providing them with vital financial support for their education after high school. The Noble Knight Award recognizes students who have demonstrated exceptional kindness and selflessness by assisting others, embodying the spirit of generosity that Joe exemplified. As the first recipient of this award in 2007, Joe's legacy of compassion continues to inspire young minds within the community.

We extend our heartfelt gratitude to the Caring Communities Foundation for their unwavering support in making this scholarship possible. Their commitment to fostering educational opportunities and community growth has allowed us to honor Joe's memory in a meaningful way. By empowering the next generation of students through this scholarship, we are not only celebrating Joe's legacy but also encouraging a culture of kindness and generosity that he so passionately embodied. Together, we are nurturing the values that Joe stood for, ensuring that his spirit lives on through the lives of those who benefit from this scholarship.

Real Life Center

The Real Life Center is deeply grateful for Caring Communities Foundation's generous grant, which was used to provide financial assistance to families in Coweta County facing critical needs.

As of November 11, 2025, we have distributed \$86,772.49 in financial assistance to Coweta County clients, helping with housing and utilities. Since September 1st, we have seen an 89% increase in new clients seeking financial help, reflecting the growing need in our community. We anticipate that client financial assistance in Coweta County will reach \$100,000 by the end of 2025, reflecting our continued commitment to supporting families in need.

Your support, along with other grants and donations, enables us to continue serving families in crisis and offering hope during difficult times. We truly value community partners like you who make this work possible.

RiverLife

RiverLife is sincerely grateful to be the recipient of a \$2,750 grant from the Caring Communities Foundation. This funding helped pay our Project Manager, John Maniaci, in January of this year, and we couldn't do what we do without him! John not only manages the individual projects, he also assesses them, purchases materials and coordinates volunteers for a seamless experience helping our neighbors in need. Backstreet Community Arts

The grant from Coweta Communities Foundation awarded to Backstreet Community Arts is a gift that did far more than keep our doors open (though it certainly did that!). Because of this support, our free open art studio remained uninterrupted while experiencing a 30% increase in weekly attendance, and we were able to launch one of our most joyful programs: Project Ukulele. This six-month collaboration with Hoping Forward brought adults with developmental disabilities together twice a month for themed sessions blending music, movement, visual art, and storytelling, creating an inclusive space for creative expression, laughter, and connection. From strumming Beatles songs to crafting rain sticks and exploring sound through imagination, participants engaged in ways that felt both comfortable and empowering. The impact of this grant lives on in the joy, confidence, and connection it inspired. Thank you for helping us make music together and continue bringing the healing power of art to our community.

Despite living with intellectual and developmental differences (aka/disABILITIES) she never lets it get her down. Loni avidly takes part in every aspect of the Two Sparrows Village Day & Community Access programs. She and her Two Sparrows Village friends love swimming and pair up often to work wonders on the display shelves at Graceland and Clothes Less Traveled. They are amazing volunteers and making positive contributions through our partnerships.

Loni has an interest in the field of culinary and dining services. When others are having downtime, Loni volunteers to wipe down counters and sweep before her family picks her up. During 2025, Loni's wish was to attend the day program 3-4 days a week, but her family had to pay out of pocket until she was finally off the waiting list for a NOW/COMP Medicaid waiver. Funding in the amount of \$1500 from Caring Communities (formerly known as Coweta Community Foundation) bridged the gap in funding for Loni to attend our day program one additional day for 15 weeks until her waiver was recently approved. This allowed Loni and her Two Sparrows Village friends to have meaningful engagement and opportunities to address social determinants of health so they may thrive and give back to their communities.

Newnan Theatre Company

On behalf of Newnan Theatre Company, we extend our heartfelt thanks for your generous grant in support of our Academy Kids program. Your contribution opened the door for children ages 8 to 18 (3rd–12th grade) to participate in our Fall Academy who otherwise would not have been able to afford tuition. Because of your generosity, these young performers were able to experience high-quality theatre education, build confidence, and find a safe and inspiring place to express themselves.

Your support has had an even broader impact than you may realize. This year, our programs welcomed students not only from Coweta County but also from several surrounding communities. West Georgia Technical College

The Coweta Together Impact Grant has been pivotal in advancing West Georgia Technical College's Adult Education mission. Grant funds supported operating costs for the Coweta Pearson VUE Testing Center, enabling 1,157 community-based certification exams. These included high-demand credentials such as GED, CompTIA, Georgia Insurance Department, Child Development Associate, Evaluation Systems (OS), and GACE Parapro. This funding has greatly enhanced access to testing for adult learners and job seekers, with each certification strengthening our region's skilled workforce.

Keris Kares

The Caring Communities Foundation grant played a pivotal role in Keris Kares operations, providing essential support during a critical period leading up to our Annual Race. This grant covered rent expenses, ensuring that volunteers and staff had a designated space to plan, prepare, and execute one of our most significant fundraising events. By alleviating the financial burden associated with overhead expenses, the grant allowed Keris Kares to focus its limited resources on the most critical aspects of its mission: providing hope, guidance, and essential services to individuals battling pediatric cancer. Notably, we utilized funds typically allocated for rent to serve dinner to families residing at Ronald McDonald House Atlanta Campus. This grant proved to be a vital lifeline, helping to sustain the foundation's mission and expand its impact within the community.

NICU Parent Club

This past year, the grant supported NPC in essential operational areas such as accounting, utilities, insurance premiums, and website maintenance. Because our organization currently operates with minimal overhead, we were able to stretch these funds even further to directly enhance one of our vital programs for NICU families. One of the most meaningful outcomes was the expansion of our patient bag program, which provides comfort and practical support to every family entering the NICU at Piedmont Newnan and Piedmont Fayette hospitals. Thanks to your grant, we were able to purchase the materials needed to fill these bags with thoughtful, useful items. We're deeply grateful for your partnership and look forward to a continued relationship with Caring Communities Foundation.



Hope Revisited

Hope Revisited was established in February of 2021 with a goal of reintegrating families that have been separated due to various life circumstances, into healthy sustainable family units and creating strong family bonds that will last for generations to come.

Hope Revisited is using a model that creates, promotes and sustains long term change for families in our community. The model raises families that are strong and can withstand tribulations and life circumstances that are thrown their way. These positive changes will affect families for generations to come and make our community a better place to raise families that stay together and support each other even in the toughest of times. With help from Caring Communities Foundation's grant, we were able to offer monthly parenting classes and oversaw 22 family reunifications. We are deeply grateful for the support and could not see the positive results for our families without our amazing community.



Coweta FORCE

Because of Caring Communities Foundation's support, Coweta FORCE was able to provide scholarships for three women to enter our recovery-focused supportive housing program.

Each woman is a mother, a daughter, and a friend and each has taken brave steps toward wellness, stability, and renewed purpose.

Through safe housing and recovery support, they've been restored to health and hope, rebuilding relationships and moving forward as productive, engaged members of their families and our community.

We're deeply grateful for this investment in recovery and the lasting change it helps make possible.



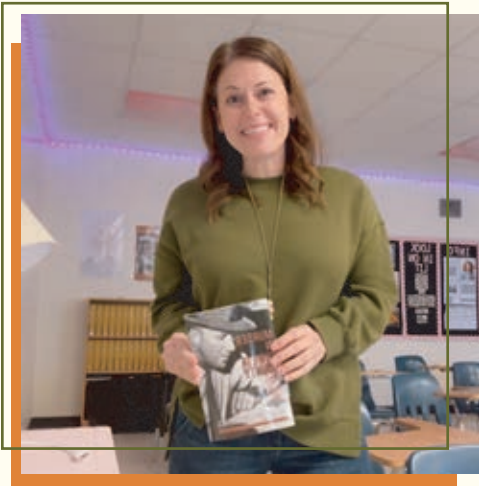
Coweta Samaritan Clinic

The Caring Communities Foundation's generous grant has made a significant impact on the Coweta Samaritan Clinic's ability to provide essential medications to our patients this year. While we are fortunate to have been able to secure more than \$3.4 million in prescription medications through pharmaceutical patient assistance programs, there remained a critical gap of approximately \$10,000 in medications we had to purchase outright. These items include antibiotics, steroids, blood pressure medications, and other over-the-counter treatments. The Foundation's support directly helped us cover these necessary costs, ensuring that our uninsured neighbors received the medications they needed without financial hardship. We are deeply grateful for this partnership and the difference it makes in the health and well-being of those we are privileged to serve.

EDUCATION GRANT STORIES...



Anna Bassett – East Coweta High School

Thanks to the generous support of the Caring Community Foundation Grant, our classroom has experienced a true transformation in how we study Murder in Coweta County. Because every student now has their own copy of the novel, we’ve removed financial barriers that often limit access to important literature. With a book they can call their own, students are annotating, asking questions, and engaging with the story in meaningful, personal ways.

The grant has also allowed us to move beyond traditional lectures and create hands-on, immersive learning experiences that bring this local story to life. Through character studies, historical research, and field trips, students are exploring themes such as social class, the historical relevance of literature, and local crime with newfound curiosity. We’ve seen stronger comprehension, sharper critical thinking, and a genuine excitement for reading.

Most importantly, this initiative demonstrates the power of direct access to literature. Students who once felt distant from historical-based texts are now contributing confidently to discussions, writing thoughtful essays, and connecting Barnes’ novel to issues they recognize in their own community. The Caring Communities Foundation hasn’t just provided books—it has opened doors to deeper learning and meaningful personal growth.



Paula Corley – White Oak Elementary

Our grant project titled Create, Code, Communicate: Storytelling with Ozobots gave students the opportunity to blend science, engineering, creativity, and literacy through an innovative, grant-funded storytelling experience. Students worked in collaborative groups to select a story, map out key plot points, and design paper pathways for their Ozobots to follow by using color-coded commands that brought each narrative to life. They tested and refined their programs before presenting their robot-guided story maps, complete with interactive elements such as timed pauses, lights, and sounds. Through this hands-on project, students strengthened their sequencing, cooperation, problem-solving, and programming skills while discovering new excitement for both language arts and STEM learning.

Connie Lytten – Westside School

Westside recently received a grant that enabled us to purchase two virtual reality headsets for our program. These headsets allow teachers to bring “real-life” experiences into the classroom, giving students opportunities that cannot be replicated in a textbook. Through VR, students have explored different parts of the world—they have visited landmarks, swum in the ocean, traveled back in time, and even experienced the desert firsthand. These virtual experiences make history and science come alive, engaging students in ways traditional lessons cannot. All students enjoy using the headsets, often without even realizing they are learning. Teachers have noted that during VR lessons, students remain highly engaged, and behavior problems are nearly nonexistent!



Caroline Rothschild- Madras Middle School

I am so thankful to the Caring Communities Foundation and its help in expanding Madras Middle School's Therapy Dog Program! The support from the Classroom Education Grant allowed us to purchase exactly what we needed to create a calming space for students to enjoy time with our therapy dog, Dolly. This cozy spot in our counseling office is now complete with comfortable furniture and fun interactive materials. It has become a welcoming space that students can use to take a break from school-day stress. We are already seeing positive results from the support of the grant, including reduced anxiety, improved emotion regulation, and positive connections. Thank you, CCF!

Amanda Scogin – Glanton Elementary School

Thank you to Caring Communities Foundation for the funds to purchase Ozobots. Ozobots bring learning to life across the curriculum by allowing students to code their thinking in creative, hands-on ways. In ELA, students use Ozobots to travel along plot diagrams, demonstrating the sequence of a story as the robot moves through exposition, rising action, climax, falling action, and resolution. In math and social studies, students design city maps and historical timelines, coding the Ozobot to move through key locations or events in order. In science, students can program their Ozobots to model experiment results, such as changes over time or cause-and-effect relationships. Across all subjects, Ozobots help students visualize ideas, build problem-solving skills, and deepen understanding through interactive learning.
